NO RELIEF FOR LADY PANTHERS AGAINST FORT VALLEY

If you're looking to break a three-game losing streak in Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC) women's basketball, one of the toughest places to do that is in Fort Valley, Georgia, against the Lady Wildcats of Fort Valley State University. That was the challenge facing the Lady Panthers of Clark Atlanta University (CAU) who had not won a game in their last three outings. After tonight's 74-65 loss to the Lady Wildcats, the Lady Panther skid is now at four.

Similar to their last three losses, the Lady Panthers' game got off to a horrendous start from the floor. Converting on only seven of 35 shots, the Lady Panthers could manage only a 20% field-goal performance in the first half. By contrast, the Lady Wildcats were 14 of 35 (40%) in the first half. The consequence of the first-half shooting by the Lady Panthers was a 35-22 lead for the Lady Wildcats at the intermission.

Again, the Lady Panthers put together a better second half from the floor, converting on 13 of 35 shots and outscoring the Lady Wildcats 43-39. The 13 point halftime spread, however, was too much for the Lady Panthers to overcome.

Three Lady Panthers finished with double-figure scoring. Junior Danielle Walker was the game's high scorer with 23 points. She also had 10 rebounds. Shantrell Moss had 18 points and 13 rebounds. Jessica Wright contributed 10 points.

The Lady Panthers are now 10-8 overall and 6-5 in the SIAC.
