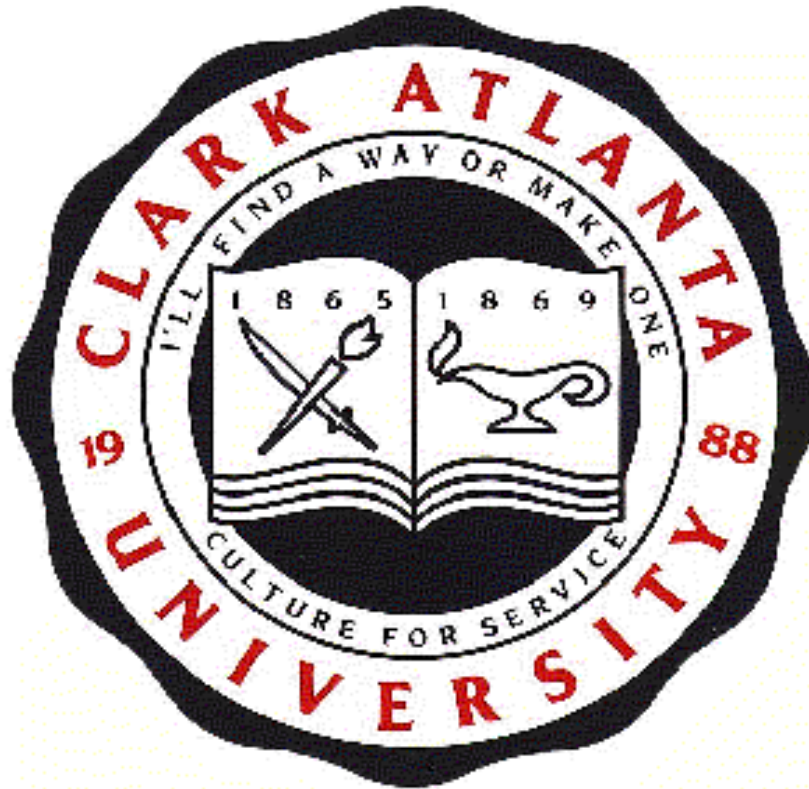

Admissions

The admissions procedures for enrollment in the Clark Atlanta University Summer Session are as follows:

Clark Atlanta University Continuing Undergraduate and Graduate Students:

- Complete a Web registration form.
- Prepare your schedule of courses.
- Obtain your academic advisor's signature.
- Take your signed Web registration form to the designate PIN station.
- Obtain your PIN.
- Log on to <http://bannerweb.cau.edu:8820> and register for your classes.
- Once registered, you must pay the appropriate tuition and fees in the Office of Student Accounts to ensure your enrollment for the term.

Transient Students (Undergraduate & Graduate):

- Complete an official Summer School Transient Permission Form.
- Submit the form to the Office of Admissions along with a "Letter of Good Standing" from your home school.
- The letter of "Good Standing" must include a list of courses that are desired and the approval for the courses from the home school.
- A Dean or an academic advisor at the home institution must sign the letter of "Good Standing."
- The school's institutional seal must appear on the document.
- Once the application is received and processed by the Office of Admissions, the student should report to the Office of the University Registrar or designated location for further instructions and/or information regarding registration and enrollment.

Please note: Courses taken during the Summer Session offer no guarantee of admission to a Clark Atlanta University degree program. All new transient and graduate students must submit the following information to the Student Health Center prior to registration:

- Proof of immunizations (measles-dose #1 and dose #2); mumps, rubella, diphtheria/tetanus.
- Results of tuberculin skin test or chest x-ray (current or within one year)
- Proof of health insurance is required of all international students and students residing in University residential halls. Insurance may be purchased during registration.

Registration

Advisement: Summer School advisement starts April 2, 2007. Currently enrolled students at Clark Atlanta University should be advised by their program chair/advisor. Transient students should be advised according to the process at their home institution.

Registration: Summer School registration is scheduled to open, for continuing students, on April 9, 2007. Transient students for the Summer Session will have the opportunity to begin registration May 1, 2007. Please check the Academic Calendar for appropriate registration, enrollment and drop/add deadlines. All students must log on to <http://bannerweb.cau.edu:8820> to register for courses. The Web will remain open for students until the end of the late registration period. Students who are registered and enrolled by the end of the late registration period will have the opportunity to drop/add classes online thru the end of the drop/add period. Any student who is not registered and enrolled by the end of the late registration period will not be allowed to enroll for the summer session.

Enrollment: All students must financially enroll by the designated deadline in the Summer Session Calendar. Once courses have been registered, students must officially enroll. Enrollment (fee payment) must be completed with the Office of Student Accounts via the mail, telephone, internet, or in person by the appropriate deadline as indicated on the Calendar. All tuition and fees must be paid in full or classes and registration will be cancelled for students who are not officially enrolled.

Late Registration: Summer Session late registration begins on May 29, 2007, and ends on June 6, 2007. A \$50.00 late fee will be assessed for all students who are not officially enrolled by the close of business on May 28, 2007.

Course Withdrawal: Summer Session course withdrawal dates and deadlines can be found on the Summer Session Calendar. The deadline to withdraw from a course for all sessions is **July 5, 2007**. Students who submit an application to withdraw from a course by this date to the Office of the University Registrar will receive a final grade of "W" for the course(s) requested. A course withdrawal form can be picked up from the Office of the University Registrar located in Trevor Arnett Room 102. **Withdrawal from a course will not result in a refund of tuition to the student.**

Cross Registration: During the Summer Session, Clark Atlanta University does not participate in cross registration thru the AUC consortium or the ARCHE consortium. Please check the academic calendar for appropriate deadlines for cross registration during the Fall and Spring terms.

Financial Aid

Summer 2007 is an extension of the 2006-2007 academic year. Therefore, summer eligibility for financial aid will be based on the results of the 2006-2008 Free Application for Financial Aid (FASFA) and the amount of unused eligibility from the 2006-2007 school year.

Financial Aid for Summer Session: Applicants for financial aid for the summer session are required to submit a Clark Atlanta University application for Financial Aid (Summer 2007) and Master Promissory Note (not required if a loan was received Fall or Spring 2006-2007).

Transient Students - Incoming transient students interested in arranging financial aid for the summer session are to consult with the financial aid officers at their home institution. Outgoing transient students cannot receive financial aid from Clark Atlanta University.

Stafford Loans: Summer borrowing for the Stafford Loan program will be affected by how much you have borrowed during 2006-2007. If you were enrolled anywhere and received a Stafford Loan for 2006-2007, you may or may not be eligible to receive a loan for the Summer. Your financial aid advisor can help determine the best course of action.

Undergraduate Georgia Residents: If you will be enrolled for 12 hours of undergraduate course work, submit a 2006-2007 Georgia Student Grant Application (if you have not done so). The grant will be applied to your account after the drop/add period for the summer session.

Reminders:

- Your loan will come in two disbursements, the second of which you will not receive until the midpoint of the summer term.
- The application priority deadline for summer assistance is March 1, 2007.
- Inform the Office of Student Financial Aid immediately if there is any change in the number of hours in which you enroll for the summer.

Tuition and Fees

Tuition and fees for the Clark Atlanta University Summer Session are due on or before **June 6, 2007**.

Tuition for Summer School is:

\$365.00 per credit hour for graduate and undergraduate.
(NOTE: THE ABOVE FEE IS SUBJECT TO CHANGE.)

ALL STUDENTS MUST COMPLETE FINANCIAL ENROLLMENT.

Payment Methods: Cashier's checks, personal checks, money orders, certified checks, VISA, MasterCard, American Express or Discover cards. Monies for personal expenses of students may not be included in payments made to the University. The student's name, social security number (not the parent's) should be written on his/her payment.

Note: For proper credit, please record the student's name and social security/identification number on each payment.

Refund and Withdrawals: Students withdrawing from the University during the registration period will be refunded based upon the following table.

Outstanding Balance:

In an effort to ensure all Clark Atlanta University students have the same opportunity during the Summer and Fall 2007 registration, the following guidelines have been mandated by the University.

- If a student has an **outstanding balance** as of the Spring 2007 semester, he/she **will not be allowed to register** for Summer 2007 or Fall 2007.
- An Accounts Receivable (AR) hold will be placed on the student's account until the balance is paid.
- **Once the Outstanding Balance is paid, the AR hold will be removed and the student can immediately register via the Web. The student's PIN will be active.**
- **Please note that course availability will be limited, and the University does not guarantee courses for late registrants .**

Late Fee: A \$50.00 late fee will be assessed for any student who begins registration on May 29, 2007. All registration and enrollment activities will end on June 6, 2007. **CLASSES WILL BE CANCELLED FOR ALL STUDENTS WHO ARE NOT OFFICIALLY REGISTERED AND ENROLLED BY June 6, 2007.**

General Information

Employee Waivers: Clark Atlanta University full-time employees are not eligible for tuition waivers during the summer. However, their spouses and eligible dependents qualify for tuition waiver benefits after a minimum of two years of full-time employment (see University policy in the staff handbook.)

Insurance: Insurance is mandatory for all students who will reside in Clark Atlanta University residence halls. Insurance is optional for all students living off campus. Insurance may be purchased in the Office of Student Accounts.

Grades: All students must log on to <http://bannerweb.cau.edu:8820> in order to view their grades. Transient students must submit an official transcript request with the Office of the University Registrar in order to have their transcript issued to their home institution. Official transcripts are \$8.00 per request.

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

Directory Information

In its discretion, the University may disclose, publish, or provide Directory Information concerning a student without consent or a record of disclosure. Directory Information shall include: a student's name, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, major field of study, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, the most recent previous educational agency or institution attended by the student, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, and other similar information.

Students may withhold Directory Information by notifying the Office of the University Registrar in writing within 10 calendar days after the first scheduled day of classes of the fall term of the academic year. The University will honor all written requests for nondisclosure for only one (1) academic year; therefore, authorization to withhold Directory Information must be filed annually.
