Dear CAU Family:

Over the past few days, extensive environmental testing has indicated the presence of mold in portions of Haven-Warren Hall. To that end, effective Monday, March 24, 2008, the administration of the university decided to close Haven-Warren Hall and relocate all classes, offices, and activities which take place in the facility to other locations on campus. The University received an expert opinion from an industrial hygienist that it is not necessary to evacuate the building; however, the University felt it necessary to take precautionary measures.

This is an isolated circumstance; however, as a further precaution we are conducting additional tests. We will provide you with updated information once testing is complete. At this time, the University has no indication of mold in other buildings, based on the random and selected testing we have already done in other campus buildings.

An administrative team, led by Executive Vice President and Provost Brown and including Vice Presidents Bowles, Collins, Lacour, Rankin, Young and Associate Vice President Meadows, is working to make sure that our students, faculty, and staff and all CAU operations conducted in that building are relocated. This team will be at your disposal to answer any further questions.
