### **CLARK ATLANTA UNIVERSITY TO ADMIT 60 STUDENTS IMPACTED BY HURRICANE KATRINA**

**ATLANTA** (Sept.9, 2005) -- Clark Atlanta University officials announced today that the university will extend offers of full-time enrollment to 60 undergraduate students from Xavier and Dillard Universities as “special registrants” for the 2005-2006 academic year. Each student will receive tuition, fees and room and board.

Students who wish to enroll at the university must present a current university/college photo ID, a recent grade report, high school transcript or unofficial college transcript, if available from their home institutions. Broadnax, president of CAU. “Our hearts go out to them and to our own students and their families from that region.” Broadnax said he is overwhelmed by the spirited generosity of CAU students, faculty and staff, who have participated in a prayer service and are raising funds for Hurricane Katrina victims.

Formed in 1988 by the consolidation of two historic institutions, Atlanta University (1865) and Clark College (1869), Clark Atlanta University is the largest of the United Negro College Fund institutions. With an enrollment of nearly 5,000 students, CAU is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award the bachelor’s, master’s, specialist and doctoral degrees. Clark Atlanta University is the only private, historically black college or university classified as a Doctoral/Research-Intensive Institution.
