As a part of this collective and heightened effort to address crime and, whenever possible, prevent criminal activity, we ask that you "think safety first."

Please be mindful that our location in a dynamic urban center requires all of us to be aware of our surroundings and the forces that seek to disrupt the security of our peaceful atmosphere. Our campus sprawls across public streets, and we have no control over who uses those pathways.

While you are at CAU, please consider your residence halls your home away from home. Do not allow suspicious individuals access to your residence halls or leave doors open after hours. We are reminding you not to walk alone in the dark on surrounding streets of the campus, to utilize the Department of Public Safety escort service, and to walk in groups.
