Dr. Yingzhou Hu, Assistant Professor of Piano Studies at the Clark Atlanta University. Dr. Hu has performed throughout the United States and abroad in Asia and Europe. He accomplished piano solo performances at Carnegie Hall in March 2017 and November 2021. He was invited by Mike DeWine, the Governor of Ohio to play an annual piano recital at the Governor's residence as residence artist. He was the first-place winner of the Golden Classical International Music Competition in 2019 and the winner of the American Protégé International Piano Competition in 2017.

Dr. Hu received a Bachelor of Music degree from Capital University, a Master of Music degree from the Manhattan School of Music, and a Doctoral in Musical Arts degree from The Ohio State University. Dr. Hu has been awarded the 2020 Graduate Achievement Award at The Ohio State University. Additionally, he was the winner of the 2011 Karen Jean Foster Keyboard Competition at Capital University. Since 2016, He toured and performed with the Wind Symphony of Ohio State University around the United States. Moreover, He performed as a pianist in the Choir of the Hilliard Memorial Middle School, Bradley High School, and Ohio State School for the Blind.

Dr. Hu has been appointed as a visiting piano faculty member at the Peabody Institute of Johns Hopkins University in piano at Peabody. He is the Assistant Director of the Franz Liszt International Piano Festival and Competition. He had been a Collaborative Piano Faculty at Ohio Dominican University in 2018. He was a judge of the Ohio Federation of Music Festival and Competition, and the Ohio Music Teacher Association Competition. He contributes his passion to the community as well. He served as the Organist at the Riverside United Methodist Church in 2017, and as the Keyboardist at St. Paul Lutheran Church since 2018. Dr. Hu has operated a private studio for more than ten years. Dr. Hu has an excellent teaching record, which is reflected in the number of students who have won national and international competitions.
