Wednesday, March 25, 2026 – The Office of Community Standards was notified by the CAU Chief of Police of possible hazing allegations involving the Alpha Pi Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. The initial report was submitted to CAU Public Safety on March 24, 2026, at 9:53 a.m., and identified two Neophyte members were being hazed by members of the Alpha Pi Chapter.

During the investigation, interviews were conducted. Allegations of certain hazing behaviors were identified such as physical contact, abusive conduct, coercion, and Other prohibited hazing behaviors. However, nothing was proven and considered factual based on no evidence.

The Alpha Pi Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. will be placed on Social Probation, as outlined by the Office of Student Life and Engagement, effective May 13, 2026, at 12:00 a.m. (EST). This sanction will remain in effect through December 31, 2026, at 11:59 p.m. (EST).

On January 1, 2027, at 12:00 a.m. (EST), the Alpha Pi Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. will be restored to full operational status as a recognized and active student organization. At that time, the chapter will regain all rights and privileges associated with Clark Atlanta University Greek-letter organizations, including participation in on- and off-campus events and programming.

Tuesday, December 9, 2025: The Gamma Kappa Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. was placed under a Cease & Desist (C & D) Order by the Office of Student Leadership and Engagement/Greek-Life at Clark Atlanta University (CAU). This action was taken in response to allegations of *hazing* and *theft* concerning an individual aspiring to membership within the chapter.

During the investigation, interviews were conducted and allegations involving hazing and theft related to financial transactions were identified. However, based on the evidence available, the allegations could not be substantiated or established as factual, and no evidence directly linked the alleged conduct to the chapter or any specific individual.

March 30, 2026 - The Gamma Kappa Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. was reported following the release of a video that had been recorded live. The video appeared to show chapter members positioning neophytes in a straight line and participating in activities that resembled an unofficial probate presentation. Chapter members were also observed yelling at the neophytes and using profanity during the recorded activity. As a result of the incident, the chapter was immediately placed on Social Probation effective that date and currently remains on social probation as September 10, 2026.

Wednesday, April 15, 2026 – **The Office of Community Standards was notified by the CAU Vice President for Enrollment Management and Student Life of possible hazing allegations that was received the Office of the General Counsel involving the Sigma Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. It was reported that a neophyte was instructed to engage in activities that were considered inappropriate. Specifically, the neophyte was allegedly required to bring pies to class for a prophyte and was also instructed to eat the pie in the presence of the prophyte.**

The Office of Community Standards proposes that, effective April 30, 2026, the Sigma Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. retain full operational rights and continue functioning as a sorority in good standing.
