### *General Function (Description):*

The Department of Religion and Philosophy invites applications for a tenure-track faculty position at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor starting August 2024. Candidates must have earned a doctorate in Philosophy, as well as exhibit a commitment to teaching, research and service to the department, school and University. ABDs are welcome to apply for the position.

### *Examples of Duties and Responsibilities:*

1. Teach undergraduate courses in Philosophy.
2. Advise and mentor undergraduate majors and minors in Philosophy and Religion.
3. Conduct research and publication in refereed academic and professional journals in Philosophy.
4. Provide service to department, school, and university

Faculty in the department should be able to teach Critical Thinking as well as Introductory courses in Philosophy and Ethics, as well as a variety of major courses.

### *Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:*

The AOS and AOC for this job are open, but the department is looking for a philosophical generalist who can teach on a wide scope of philosophical topics and areas. The capacity and willingness to teach African- American philosophy is preferred.
